COVID UPDATE

What has changed

England has returned to Plan A.

This means:

- The government is no longer asking people to work from home if they can. People should now talk to their employers to agree arrangements to return to the office.
- Face coverings are no longer advised for staff and pupils in secondary school and college classrooms.
- Face coverings are no longer advised for staff and pupils in communal areas of secondary schools, nor for staff in communal areas of primaries.
- There is no longer a legal requirement to wear a face covering. The government suggests that you continue to wear a face covering in crowded and enclosed spaces where you may come into contact with other people you do not normally meet.
- Venues and events are no longer required by law to check visitors' NHS COVID Pass. The NHS COVID Pass can still be used on a voluntary basis.

Applications open for **Omicron grant to support** leisure and hospitality businesses

The Omicron Hospitality and Leisure Grant is being administered by North West Leicestershire District Council on behalf of the government, and will support hospitality, leisure, and accommodation businesses that have been impacted by the Omicron variant.

Eligible businesses will receive a one-off grant of up to £6,000.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee



In 2022, the May bank holiday weekend will be moved to Thursday 2 June and an additional Bank Holiday on Friday 3 June will see a four-day weekend to celebrate Her Majesty The Queen's Platinum Jubilee - the first time any British monarch has reached this historic milestone. Details of funding and other ways to get involved in the jubilee celebrations are below.

NWLDC will be launching a £250 Platinum Jubilee Grant that will be open to parish councils, community groups and schools (schools need to evidence that their project is totally inclusive of the community). Applications open on 31 Jan and Close on 14 April.

The Let's Create Jubilee Fund is a £5 million programme that will support community and voluntary organisations in England to develop creative and cultural activities.

The Awards for All programme is now accepting applications that celebrate the Platinum Jubilee. strongest projects will also promote relationships across generations or develop the skills and experience of communities or encourage the care of/action in the natural world as part of the celebrations.

The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) is a tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022. Everyone across the UK is being invited to plant trees through to the end of the Jubilee year in 2022.

Fortnum & Mason has launched the nationwide competition to find a pudding to celebrate The Queen in her Platinum Jubilee year. The winning pudding will be an important part of the celebrations marking Her Majesty's 70 years as Monarch. And the creator of the winning pudding will be invited to be at the centre of the celebrations.
