Prominent building to be restored thanks to council purchase



The row of terraced properties on the corner of Marlborough Square and Belvoir Road will receive a full renovation, creating 10 new first floor apartments and improving the business units on the ground floor.

The council is investing £4.5 million to bring the building up to date, complementing work to Marlborough Square.

North West Leicestershire volunteers first in the UK to trial customisable recycling trolley

Pioneering residents in North West Leicestershire are the first in the country to trial a new recycling trolley.



As part of its Recycle More... campaign, North West Leicestershire District Council (NWLDC) has provided 250 volunteers with a customisable trolley for separated recycling to be taken to the kerbside. More than 4,500 residents applied for the trial, with 250 selected to put the trolleys through their paces.

Local Policing



Leicestershire Police often receive communication from those in rural communities asking them to join various WhatsApp groups.

Their rural team is responsible for the entire of Leicestershire and Rutland which makes it incredibly difficult for them to be part of all of the various groups across such a huge area. In order to try and improve their communication with those who live and work in the rural areas of Leicestershire and Rutland, they have set up Operation Silence.

The idea is to have one or 2 people from the various WhatsApp groups to act as a point of contact with the Police. They would be responsible for encouraging group members to report things to police as appropriate (999/101 or online) as well as regularly speaking to the Rural Policing Team face to face and on the phone / Skype etc and passing messages back to the community.

The focus is on improving confidence and communication to as many people as they can in the rural and farming community. They welcome contact from NFU groups, Young Farmers, current local and village groups or equestrian WhatsApp groups. Anything at all to benefit with more eyes and ears in rural communities.
