Council Tax Freeze For 13th Year

North West Leicestershire District Council (NWLDC) has frozen its portion of the council tax bill for a 13th consecutive year, recognising the financial challenges many have faced in a tough year. A Band D property will pay £158.58 to NWLDC in the next yearexactly the same as a household in this band paid back in 2009 for the services the district council provides.

Additional Garden Waste Service

NWLDC's Cabinet has agreed some key changes to the garden waste service. There is now an annual charge of £45.00 to have an additional garden waste bin emptied. Your first garden waste bin will continue to be emptied free of charge. Residents who would like to join the additional garden waste service from 1 June can register their interest here.

Leicestershire County Council's (LCC's) HS2 team has updated that there is no further news on the forward programme for HS2 through Leicestershire. The Department for Transport (DfT) has emailed to advise that they are 'at the early planning stage'.

LCC continues to hold parish council 'drop-in' sessions on the first Tuesday of

The East Midlands Freeport has secured formal Government approval for its plans to offer businesses locating in the Freeport special incentives. Any proposed development will be subject to following the due planning process.

Beat surgeries

PSPO for Ashby

A Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) has been introduced for Ashby to give the police the power to confiscate alcohol or psychoactive substances including nitrous oxide, khat and spice, if there are concerns around antisocial behaviour.

The PSPO covers the town centre, Hood Park and Bath Grounds. Refusing to hand over alcohol or psychoactive substances when requested could result in a £100 fine.
