Funding secured to tackle air polluting particles

A successful joint

-bid for funding will help two Councils raise awareness and tackle air pollution in Leicestershire.

Harborough District Council and North West Leicestershire District Council (NWLDC) will use the funding, totalling just over £27,000, to improve knowledge of 'particulate matter' – the term for solid particles and liquid droplets found in the air – and raise awareness of its potential impact on health.

The funding, from the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs' Air Quality Grant Programme, will cover the cost of purchasing monitoring equipment to help understand local levels of particles in the air released through the burning of solid fuel or wood stoves, etc, which is more common in rural areas.

## **Pick Your Own Street**

North West Leicestershire litter pickers clean up district's streets



Volunteers in North West Leicestershire have rallied together to combat litter in the district as part of this year's Great British Spring Clean.

North West Leicestershire District Council (NWLDC) invited local residents to take part in its 'Pick Your Own Street' campaign in an effort to join in with Keep Britain Tidy's national initiative.

More than 100 people took part to clean up their local areas, joining forces with neighbours, friends, and family to collect an impressive 73 bags of rubbish using equipment provided by the council.

Once they were finished litter picking, residents left the bags at collection points for the council's waste team to dispose of at the depot off Linden Way in Coalville.

The campaign forms part of the

council's Zero Litter campaign which aims to tackle the district's litter problems.

#### Business Growth Grant

your business? The Business Growth Grant is open for applications. This grant, from the <u>Business Gateway</u> Growth Hub, is available to existing small and medium-sized businesses based in Leicester and Leicestershire. Grants from £2,000 to £25,000\* are available providing 35% towards project costs. Grants can be used to help your business grow or diversify e.g. innovative technology products, capital equipment, premises refurbishment, marketing/promotional activity, or other revenue costs. (The maximum revenue grant is £7,500). A Business Gateway Adviser will support you throughout the process.

This grant is part-funded by the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) and run by Leicester City Council in partnership with East Midlands Chamber (Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire, Leicestershire), Leicestershire County Council and the Leicester and Leicestershire Enterprise Partnership Ltd (LLEP).
