## **Pension Credits**



# Department for Work & Pensions

Do you know of any pensioners who are currently struggling with their bills? According to the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP), around 850,000 households are missing out on vital <u>Pension Credit</u> support.

More than 1.4 million pensioners are currently receiving Pension Credit but there is still a large number who are not claiming this extra financial help. Pension Credit is designed to help with daily living costs for people over state pension age and on a low income.

Even a small award can provide access to a wide range of other benefits, such as help with housing costs, council tax or heating bills. For those over 75, this includes continued entitlement to a free TV licence.

An <u>easy read guide</u> explains how to get help and there is a <u>Pension Credit</u> <u>calculator</u> to help people work out if they are eligible. The credit can be claimed <u>online</u> or people can call 0800 991234 for more information. People can also seek support from charities such as <u>Citizens' Advice, National</u> <u>Debtline</u> and <u>StepChange Debt Charity</u>.

## **Interactive Walks Map**



Leicestershire residents are being invited to use an <u>interactive map</u> to explore Leicestershire's 1,800 miles of public footpaths.

As well as highlighting over 150 specific walks across the county, the interactive map allows people to view right of way footpaths. The map also allows users to filter by routes, distance and elements of interest, such as historic locations or family-friendly walks that pass play areas. The walks can also be viewed by their difficulty, so people of all abilities can determine which ones will suit best.

Walking maps are available to <u>download</u> and free hard copies of maps can be requested by emailing <u>Choose How you</u> <u>Move</u>, stating your name, address and the leaflet(s) you would like.



## New Code of Conduct

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North West Leicestershire



Has your council signed up to the new code of conduct yet? Following on from the successful training sessions organised through the district council's Democratic Services team, <u>Leicestershire</u> <u>& Rutland Association of Local Councils</u> (LRALC) is encouraging all local councils to consider adopting the new Code of Conduct.

This new model code was developed at a national level by the Local Government Association and is endorsed by the National Association of Local Councils (NALC).

#### **NALC Survey**

NALC has published a new <u>survey</u>



on dementia-friendly councils.

This follows on from the publication of NALC's <u>Dementia-Friendly</u>

<u>Communities guide</u>, which demonstrates the positive impact of building dementia -friendly communities and providing local councils with the tools to help develop their own.

This new survey aims to gather feedback on the usage and effectiveness of this publication. All responses will help support local councils in ensuring that people living with dementia and their families continue to be included in all aspects of community life. The survey closes on 22 July 2022.

#### **Energy Rebate Scheme**

If your town or parish council receives any enquiries about the Government Energy Rebate scheme, please direct residents to the district council's webpage.

You will be aware that households in England in council tax bands A to D are entitled to a one-off £150 non-repayable rebate. The majority of those who pay by direct debit have been paid directly into their bank account. Anyone who pays another way, and direct debit payers still waiting, should receive a letter by the end of June with instructions on how to claim payment at the post office. Please direct residents to the <u>Post Office branch finder</u> for details on their nearest post office, including opening times.

If a resident is contacted by someone claiming to be from the district council and who asks for their bank details, please be aware that this is a scam. The council will never contact residents to ask for bank details by phone, email or text. ## **National Forest Survey**

#### Funding

#### <u>Community</u> Ownership Fund

This £150 million fund has been set up to help communities take ownership of assets at risk of closure. Voluntary and community organisations can bid for up to £250,000 (match funding required) in Round 2 of the fund. Parish councils cannot apply but are encouraged to support local groups. Funding may support the purchase and/or renovation costs of community assets. The <u>Expression of Interest</u> stage opened on 10 June and the bidding window for this round closes on 19 August.

<u>Shire Grants</u> Get ready for Round 2 of the



SHIRE Community Grant, which will open on 6 July. The programme enables VCSE (Voluntary, Community & Social Enterprise) sector organisations to deliver community-based projects, services and activities that help to improve the lives of vulnerable people in Leicestershire. Organisations can apply for either a Small Grant (up to £3,000) or a Large Grant (up to £10,000). Parish and town councils are eligible to apply.

#### Defibrillators



The registered charity, <u>London</u> <u>Hearts</u>, has launched an initiative to

assist communities to obtain life-saving defibrillator equipment.

The charity is currently offering a £300 grant towards the cost of every defibrillator it supplies across the UK. They also supply free online training.
