It's that time of year again — NWLDC waste collection calendar deliveries!

<u>Deliveries have already started</u> and will continue throughout November, finishing on Monday 28 November. The calendars cover 12 months of collections, starting from December 2022 (including Christmas and New Year collections) through to November 2023.

As with previous years, NWLDC will suspend two garden waste collections in December and January.

All households will receive three consecutive black bin collections during this period.

#### Warm Spaces Grant

NWLDC is offering grants of up to £250 to support venues that are providing 'warm



spaces' for residents during the cost of living crisis. We may consider requests for more than £250 where there is an exceptional need or benefit.

In order to be eligible for funding, groups will need to register as a warm space with NWLDC by completing the warm space survey and returning to Helen Crouch. A copy of the survey is attached.

You also need to demonstrate a commitment to working with other groups and partners in the area to maximise the support available to vulnerable members of the community.

Funding could cover costs such as:

- Food and drinks that are made • available to warm space users and are not part of business as usual activities
- A contribution towards heating costs where hours of opening have been extended or facilities will be open on additional days in order to provide the warm space
- Costs associated with providing recreational activities for warm space users
- Costs associated with providing advice services to warm space users
- Transport costs where warm space providers are transporting residents to and from the warm space

To apply for this funding, please email grants with the following information:



- What costs you would like the NWLDC funding to cover
- Evidence of exceptional need or . benefit for requests over £250
- Your organisation's constitution
- Quotes for the items that you would like us to fund
- A recent bank statement

The grant fund will be open for applications until Friday 31 March 2023 or until the grant budget has been allocated.
