New data from the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) shows shoppers lost over £15 million to cyber criminals during the festive period last year, with an average loss of £1,000 per person.

Take these steps to ensure you are more protected during the Christmas shopping period.

- <u>Protect your accounts</u>: set up 2-step
- verification and use three random words passwords



- Check before you buy
- Pay securely:
   Use a credit card when shopping online, if you have one.

## White Ribbon Day



White Ribbon Day was held on Friday 25 November and fell on the same week as the start of the FIFA Men's World Cup.

This year's campaign is titled #TheGoal and raises awareness about the challenges, and dangers, that women and girls face in traditionally maledominated contexts like the football pitch, but also public transportation.

Did you know that domestic violence and the World Cup are closely linked? As reported by the <u>National Centre for</u> <u>Domestic Violence</u>, reported incidents of domestic violence increase:

- By 26% if England play
- By 38% if England lose
- By 11% the next day, win or lose

#### **SENDIASS Website**



The new SENDIASS
Leicestershire website has just launched so that 0-25 year olds and their families

can find out more about education, health and social care, all in one place.

Working alongside Leicestershire County Council, which has designed and developed the new website, Leicestershire's Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Information Advice and Support Service (SENDIASS) has brought together information and resources to expand the reach of the service.

<u>SENDIASS Leicestershire</u> aims to empower parents, carers and young people to independently voice their

thoughts and requests around the support needed for them to achieve their full potential.

## **Winter Fuel Payments**

Last week the Government <u>announced</u> that over 11.6 million pensioners will start to receive up to £600 to help with their energy bills this winter.

Winter Fuel Payments of £324 for lower income households have been boosted this year by an additional £300 per household Pensioner Cost of Living payment, which will land in bank accounts over the next two months.

People are also reminded to check if they qualify for <u>Pension Credits</u>, which can be worth over £3,500 a year.
Pension Credit claims can be backdated by up to three months and pensioners

are being urged to claim as soon as possible, and by no later than 18 December 2022.



### **Call for Tree Wardens**

Do you know anyone who would like to help protect and maintain trees and wildlife in your community? Tree wardens help by reporting pests, disease and vandalism and help look out for opportunities to plant more trees in the local community, as well as raising awareness about the importance of trees and woodland.

Mike McIntyre is the tree warden for Lockington and Hemington, a role he took up earlier this year. Mike has been working closely with Lockington cum Hemington Parish Council.

Mike said, "We always need more tree wardens, and I would encourage anyone with the slightest interest in trees to give it a look.

Being a tree warden can involve as much or little commitment as you want to put into it, and there are no qualifications needed, just an interest in trees."

## **Boundary Review**

There's still time to respond to the Boundary Commission for England (BCE) on their final consultation on proposals for new parliamentary constituencies. Deadline for responses is 5 December.

The commission is required by Parliament to undertake an independent and impartial review of all constituencies in England, to rebalance the number of electors in each constituency. The 2023 Boundary Review also requires that the number of constituencies in England increases from 533 to 543.

The commission has listened to the feedback sent in from the public so far and has changed nearly half of the initial proposals published last year. The new revised proposals are now available to view via an interactive map on the consultation website.

Feedback can be given on anything from where the proposed electoral boundaries are to the suggestions for new constituency names.
