### Osgathorpe shows its Christmas Spirit again!

Once again, villagers generously donated food and cash gifts to our local Food Bank for Christmas, with many donating a 'reverse advent calendar'. **Stefan Olsberg**, who coordinates collections in our village, said "It's fantastic that people in Osgathorpe have been so generous, especially at this time of year. Several



villagers also kindly make regular donations during the rest of the year.

The weekly collection of donations will continue through 2023, and villagers are asked to leave any food donations in St Mary's church porch by 9am on Monday mornings. If people wish to make a financial donation, they can do so as a one-off or regularly, to the Food Bank through their website: [www.shepshedfoodbank.co.uk](http://www.shepshedfoodbank.co.uk). Financial donations are really helpful as they give the Food Bank the flexibility to buy what's required in any given week and to buy fresh and frozen produce. Sadly, with the current cost of living pressures, more and more families need the help of food banks and so anything we can give, however big or small, really does help make a difference."

**Sharon and Dave Lowth** organised a Santa's Grotto for the children of Osgathorpe on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> December. They completely transformed the Harley Hall into a magical treat for the children, a wonderful sight.
