Voter ID



Voting in the district and parish council elections on Thursday 4 May is different this year with the introduction of photo

Anyone who wants to vote in the local elections will need to present an accepted form of photo I.D.

Every voter needs to show photo I.D. to be able to cast their vote in the local elections on Thursday 4 May.

Photo I.D. that is accepted includes:

- Passport
- Driving licence
- Blue badge
- Proof of age card with PASS mark
- Certain travel concessionary cards
- National identity card
- Biometric immigration document
- Defence identity card

Don't worry – you will still be able to vote. You'll need to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate.

You can apply online at woter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk or you can complete a paper application form and send to NWLDC.

To apply for a Voter Authority Certificate, you will need to provide your:

Name | Address | Date of birth | National Insurance Number

You'll also need to submit a photograph with your application, with similar requirements as for a passport photo.

The next subscription period runs from 1 June 2023 until 31 May 2024 and costs £45 per extra garden bin.

Coronation Waiving



There are many opportunities for parish and town councils and communities to plan local events to mark this special Royal occasion.

Street Parties are encouraged

Leicestershire County Council is offering free road closure applications for street parties being held to mark the Coronation of His Majesty the King later this year.

The applications for temporary traffic orders, which involve road closures if events are being held on the highway, usually cost in the region of £400 - £650. The deadline for applications is Friday, 31 March 2023. For more information click here.

Watching it on the big screen

The BBC has informed the <u>National</u> <u>Association of Local Councils</u> (NALC) that it will allow public events to show the King's Coronation without needing a TV licence.

The special dispensation will apply for the weekend of 6-7 May 2023, which will cover the Coronation Concert and the Coronation itself.

Coronation Funding

Parish councils, community groups and schools are among those who can apply for North West Leicestershire District Council's (NWLDC) King's Coronation Grant.

Up to £250 is available to help groups organise Coronation related activities or events in their parish to commemorate the occasion on Saturday 6 May. The deadline for applications is 6 April 2023.

We have already received 20 applications from a range of parish councils, community groups, sports' clubs and social clubs.



Climate & Nature Pact

North West Leicestershire District Council (NWLDC) is one of the first 12 organisations to sign up to the Leicestershire Climate and Nature Pact.

The Pact was officially launched and signed on Tuesday 28 February, attended by representatives from more than 40 organisations who gathered to

share their ideas on how to work together towards common net zero carbon goals.



Cllr Andrew Woodman, Community Services Portfolio Holder for NWLDC, signed the pact on behalf of the council.

Spearheaded by Leicestershire County Council, working with partners and stakeholders from across the region, the pact sets out a commitment to tackle climate change, nature decline and carbon reduction.
